We are Rejudes, a national network created by young people participating in the projects developed by ChildFund Brasil whose objective is to defend the youth social rights. We believe in the strength of articulation and social mobilization to generate positive social impact. We defend and value the diversity of expressions of our culture, bringing together young people from different regions and worldviews. Since 2015, we have mobilized youth across the country to become protagonists of their stories and to exercise political participation in their communities, in Brazil and even in the world.

Rejudes is our empowerment space. Where we seek personal and professional support. It is our connection, where we have rights and we have voice.



Our network builds an autonomous and empowering trajectory and this is only possible due to the commitment of youth and the institutional support of civil society organizations partners and ChildFund Brasil.

ChildFund is an international social organization with more than 80 years of experience and presence in 58 countries. In Brazil, , since 1966, ChildFund is committed to supporting the development of children in situations of social vulnerability, giving them the opportunity to become young people, adults, parents and leaders who will bring sustainable and positive change to communities.

It is also part of the ChildFund's mission to mobilize people and institutions to act in valuing, protecting and promoting the rights of children and adolescents. It is with this purpose that ChildFund Brasil promotes, strengthens and empowers the action of the Youth Network in search of their Social Rights - Rejudes.





What is it like to be a young Brazilian?

What is it to be a young? Is there a more existential phrase than that? Or a stage more existential than that?

Youth brings with it countless questions, which influence the process of identity formation that we all go through, before we can be considered adults. Who am I? What do I like? What will my profession be? Which way do I want to go? Which mark will I leave on the world?

What it is to be a young person is a branching question chain, in which the more we explore, the more questions arise from it – even more so when we insert into this equation an important variable: what it is to be a **young Brazilian person**?

According to the 2022 IBGE Census, out of a universe of 214,800,000 Brazilian citizens, 32,044,000 are in the age group of 15 to 24 years. Of the more than 32 million young people in Brazil, an estimated 84% live in urban areas and 9.3% of people aged 14 and over are unemployed.

Social inequality still defines the opportunities that multiple Brazilian youth will have access to, whether in education and academic training, in access to professionalization or to the labor market. The violence, especially within the

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social and racial context, still appears in worrying indexes, and problems related to the mental health of young people have had increasing prevalence, not only in Brazil, but throughout the world.

Young people do not want only to eat, they also want entertainment and art and, of course, to go anywhere. Young people want to be heard and to participate in the decisions and policies that concern their development and the construction of their future.

It was with this mission that Rejudes came to the world: to play an essential role in mobilizing and empowering young people to become protagonists in the construction of a more just, sustainable and inclusive world, contributing to the development of youth and fostering their participation in the search for and defense of their social rights.

But now the burning question is: what is it like to be a **young Brazilian Rejudian**?

"No one but us can communicate better, no one but us can actively talk about what we live. And this meeting has been for this purpose, to show truly leadership, what is it youth protagonism."

Our history, our roots

Rejudes is born from a common need among young people who already participated in programs in ChildFund Brasil's partner Social Organizations (PSOs): to have their own identity.

In 2015, the work of young people with their communities for the guarantee and realization of rights was already a reality within the PSOs. ChildFund Brasil promoted the training of young people in MJPOP, a methodology for monitoring public policies. The group of young people trained in the PSOs, from the formation, began to recognize itself as a network.

Jorge, former participant of Rejudes in Ceará, tells us a little about this starting point:

"The Youth Network in search of their Social Rights was born in 2015 after the need to have a self-identity with specific actions aimed at young people aged 15 to 24 enrolled in the ChildFund Brasil sponsorship system, according to the PSOs were present. The first major meeting took place in July 2015, in the city of Paracatu, birthplace of the National MJPOP meeting. It was in this three-day meeting of unique experiences, tireless dialogues and unforgettable memories that we defined the directions and the name of our so dreamed network, now conceived as Rejudes. The union of regional committees and people who believed in the potential of youth was essential for the foundation of this new journey that embraced and welcomed more than 8 thousand young people to contribute to the transformation and improvement of the realities of different parts of Brazil - from the interior of Ceará to the Jequitinhonha Valley. From Rio Grande do Norte to Belo Horizonte."

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In 2016 the proposal took shape. Local committees were set up and the youth took the lead in planning and in the actions of the network.

"Local actions were the most important and challenging part, because we were putting into practice what was thought nationally with the National Committee", says Jorge.

lvis, a former representative of the National Rejudes Committee, reports that "locally, groups have engaged in identity building, Youth Statute studies, and social participation activities, such as meetings in the Town Hall, actions related to the National Youth Day and the National Day to Confront Sexual Abuse and exploitation of children and adolescents. In addition, mobilizations have been carried out proposing to integrate more young people into the fights, such as forums, exchanges between cities in the same region and local and regional meetings".





In the same year, in 2016, the **1st National Meeting of Rejudes** structured the network's intervention format. Ivis has fond memories of it:

"The 1st National Meeting, in Fortaleza, Ceará, was for sure one of the most exciting moments of this journey for me. I had never seen such a diversity of people, States, accents and ideas similar to mine. Just as important was being chosen as the national representative of the Jequitinhonha Valley: the first great opportunity that, with excitement and at the same time fear, I felt with a lot of latency. Surely this gesture of confidence of the youth that I was with made me understand the importance of my performance in this process. I was committed to the guarantee of my rights and the rights of my own."

For Jorge, the meeting was a successful milestone for the network under construction:

"Rejudes marked my life in broad and significant ways, I always say that it was the most important opportunity for a young man from the countryside of Ceará. Meeting people and a world I had not seen before during the 1st National Meeting made me fall in love with the network and our mission built since July 2015."

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In 2017, the social intervention of the network became articulated with Agenda 2030 and Rejudes promoted Free Conferences in all municipalities where the network operates, mobilizing other young people and players to the incidence of youth rights.

"As a National Committee, we are committed to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), with Human capacity building gatherings, meetings, exchanges and Youth Conferences, the creation of partnership networks and the strengthening of youth participation in the social and political scenarios of their territories. This participation sought to map, first of all, the main problems faced by young people at that time and in their territories, which led us to work and propose solutions based on our became the theme of the 2nd National Meeting: 'spare me the vexation of dying so young',* held in the city of Confins, in 2017, and totally idealized by us, the National Committee. In addition, cross-cutting themes that were interconnected with the SDGs were also addressed in our localities, such as Youth Entrepreneurship and the Labor Market, Culture and Diversity", recalls Ivis.

*This theme was translated literally from the Ney Matogrosso line "Me poupa do vexame de morrer tão moço" from the song "Pavão Mysteriozo." Ney is a brazilian singer famous for his perfomances and songs with typically brazilian elements. So, it's interesting that this name was chosen, because "Moço" is a very typical brazilian way to say young.

In 2019, Rejudes takes an important step: the elaboration of its Governance Structure. In the same year, it has also implemented the *Prepara Rejudes*, an intervention that disseminates the theme addressed during the year to young people in the municipalities, fostering debates, training and involvement of other collectives to influence the theme. And with the flame of youth protagonism shining brighter and brighter, came the pandemic.



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The Covid-19 pandemic was a period in which the network sought to reinvent itself with online actions to keep the integration of local committees, develop debates, articulations and training on the annual theme of the network. In this time of great challenges for youth, Rejudes has managed to maintain engagement and, in **2020 and 2021**, **National online meetings** were carried out, enabling the participation of other Brazilian collectives and also of young people from other countries where ChildFund operates.

The year of 2022 came in full force. Rejudes built its Strategic Document and also the Advocacy Plan and received the ChildFund International Connection award and Ser Humano ABRH-MG, in addition to having expanded its area of expertise to four other Brazilian states.

"My name is Juliana; I am 20 years old and I am from the countryside of Ceará. Talking about Rejudes, ChildFund Brasil and my institution [ChildFund's partner organization] is a subject that makes my eyes shine. I have immense gratitude for being who I am and for all the opportunities that come through the network. My brother is 11 years old and he is already part of the institution. He has me as an example and one day I wish that, just like me, he can be a young part of Rejudes and that he can live experiences as incredible as mine. My greatest desire, from the bottom of my heart, is that this story only grows and continues like this, as it has changed my life, creating realities and bringing hope to all young people, so that they believe in their potential!"

With the dedication of the youth, Rejudes continues strong, always advancing in its performance. The implementation of the strategy and the actions of the advocacy plan are challenges for the coming years.



What drives us is hope

You can already tell that Rejudes is a patchwork quilt, right? Our network gathers young people from different states, cities, ages, with different dreams, plans and paths, around the same goal: the construction of a Brazil where youth is heard and has its rights respected.

To tell you a little more about the operation of this network in practice, we have gathered a first-class team: three young Rejudians who have a lot to talk about the work they do. I give you **Fernanda Clara, Victoria and Pedro:**

What drives Rejudes?

Fernanda: Train protagonist and referential young people, and enable these young to make a difference in their localities.

Vitória: The strength of young people in wanting what is best, in discussing important issues to have knowledge, in knowing that you have several young fighting for the same goals, and as more young people, more goals will be achieved.



Pedro: Rejudes is a network of young people who demand the defense of rights; therefore, I would say that what motivates the network is the flame of youth, which shows us a path of transformation. Yes, I would say that what motivates us is hope.

Today, what is the main challenge that Rejude faces?

Fernanda: The fundraising.

Pedro: Recovering from the Covid-19 pandemic and adapting to changes that have been taking place are arduous tasks, but the network's biggest challenge is to do precisely what was proposed in its creation: to mobilize young people on how they should be protagonists of the transformations of their community.



And what are the main achievements of the Network?

Fernanda: I think all local achievements are important, but the achievements that stand out more in the whole network are: The Connection award, which brought international visibility to Rejudes, and the Ser Humano Award.

What are the matters worked by Rejudes today?

Fernanda: Diversity and inclusion, employability and entrepreneurship, fighting racism and the environment. And with the implementation of the Advocacy Plan, our actions are more focused on the area of Education.

How does Rejudes work on a day-to-day basis?

Fernanda: An annual agenda is made available every year. Local groups meet and discuss agendas and actions that are within this agenda and how they fit into their realities. In addition, Rejudes is always providing training moments for young people, so that they become more and more protagonists and references in their localities.

Pedro: In the local committees, which is where we live daily and interact with other young people, planning meetings are held following the guidelines of the National Committee, adapting to their realities, so each group has a dynamic.

How does the division of tasks and the hierarchy of Rejudes work?

Fernanda: There are local, regional and national committees, all elected by vote. The local committee is formed by young people active in their PSOs and its role is to develop, together with local groups, activities to be carried out and encourage young people in the community to participate in the actions. The regional committee is made up of four young people from each local group, their role is to represent local committees at events, meetings, trainings and other regional actions and to distribute information to local groups. The National Committee is currently composed of 12 young people, 4 from each area in which Rejudes operates. Its role is to represent Rejudes youth when it comes to communication with ChildFund and partnerships. The young people of the National Committee also have the role of making decisions that will impact the whole Rejudes, developing agendas and actions, defining themes to be worked on at the national level, planning and organizing regional and national meetings (with the support of the articulation), and also maintaining contact with the young people of the local groups, so that the agendas brought by them are discussed at meetings of the National Committee, together with the ChildFund.

How does Rejudes participate in law councils?

Fernanda: We participate in sessions in the city council, we establish contact with the bodies responsible for public policies, and some groups have already conquered space in the city youth councils.



What are the regional and national meetings like?

Fernanda: The meetings are aimed at training young people in the themes that are being worked on and also for the exchange of experiences of activities and actions that have worked in their localities. These meetings are

always very enriching, because each person brings a background and a view of where they live and connect with other realities that may be close or far from yours.

Pedro: These are moments of formation, planning, measurement and celebration of the network actions. We have the opportunity to listen to each other, suggest ways of working and meeting people and different realities.



What has motivated you to participate in Rejudes?

Fernanda: Since I was very young, I have always participated in activities developed by my PSO. When the opportunity came to participate in Rejudes it was incredible, because I had within my PSO examples of young leadership, and seeing the performance of these young people ignited in me the wish to make a difference within my community in the same way.

Vitória: By participating since I was little in the Child Fund project, I have created a very great passion for the program. When I turned 15, I joined Rejudes and that's when I learned to have a voice and fight for my rights. With each passing day, I am more passionate about the network and its purpose.

Pedro: My main motivation was to see the evolution of the young leadership who had been in the network before me, to see how much they had the ability to plan and to make this ability a reality. I wanted to be leadership, I wanted to be transformation, and today I am – thanks to Rejudes and everything I have learned in it.



How does Rejudes work?

Rejudes adopts the model of **Collaborative Governance.** This means that our governance is not top-down, it is done in a network, promoting partnerships with different organizations and social programs, in addition to dialogue between local, regional and national authorities.

We organize ourselves through ordinary and extraordinary assemblies, in a structure of committees, which, together with local social organizations, mobilize young people in a process of active participation that emerges in the periodic election of their representatives to local, regional and National Committees.

GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE:

1. Local Committee

Body of Rejudes that develop the actions planned by the Network in a local level. It is composed of PSO reference young people, project representatives of youth.




IMPACT

2. Regional Committee

Rejudes body that develops campaigns and actions at the regional level, composed of young people elected by local committees. At the meetings of the Regional Committees, the deliberations, plans and evaluations of the activities done by the local committees are carried out.



IMPACT

3. National Committee

It articulates and represents ChildFund Brasil youth at the national level, being composed of young people active in regional committees, elected by their peers. The tasks of the National Committee are: to establish a plan to define the themes and issues regarding the youth to be addressed during their respective mandate; to facilitate Rejudes national meetings; to participate in ChildFund Brasil stakeholder meetings; to create an agenda for ordinary meetings of the National Committee; to be Rejudes spokesperson in various spaces; to act in the process of multiplying the initiative.



"Participation in the National Committee was extremely important for my personal and professional development, this challenge accepted in March 2017, after being elected by the Regional Committee, going on to represent the young people who were part of the network. At that moment, I was aware of the importance of leadership for representing such a diverse and plural network, and I was sure of how much my participation, local and regional representation meant to achieve new paths with Rejudes, starting to develop intellectually and building a self-confident, resilient person concerned with broad current causes."

NETWORK INTERLOCUTORS:

1. Local Partners (LPs)

Carry out projects with young people at the local level; they provide the necessary facilities and structure for the participation of young people in Rejudes; they support the local articulation to hold trainings, gatherings and meetings and ensure the local operation of the network, making commitments in the annual planning.

"I was sponsored for more than 15 years at the *Mafo institution*, where I am still benefited with many opportunities that add and positively transform my life. From a very early age, I had the opportunity to take courses and workshops that collaborate with my academic and professional life, since as of today, I am already in the job market. Rejudes activities started to be part of my life as soon as I turned 15 years old. Since then, I have been actively involved in the Local Committee and I always try to make clear the importance of the network in my formation as a person and professional."

2. Youth educator

It is the bridge between the LPs management and the local Rejudes Committee. Person from the LPs team that mobilizes young people enrolled in the ChildFund Brasil sponsorship system and participants in the activities developed to enter in debates on youth rights at the municipal level and integrate the local Rejudes Committee.

3. Network articulator

They are a service provider connected to the partner Social organization acting in the territories by supporting the committees and educators with tools and political-pedagogical strategies to the development of Rejudes' pillars.



Our compass

With so many instances and partnerships spread across Brazil and such diverse youth, you may be wondering how Rejudes stays together and with its goals aligned at all levels of performance.

For this, we have the **Rejudes Strategy.** This tool is like our compass, a reference point for all Rejudes, playing a key role in guiding and directing which way to go.

The strategic document establishes how Rejudes will operate for a period of four years, defining guidelines for programming actions and improving the work process.

For the construction of the strategic document 2022-2026, ChildFund Brasil developed a methodological path divided into two stages: **Context analysis** and **Strategy for Rejudes actions (2023-2026)**. Throughout the process, young Rejudians have participated.

MONITORING, ASSESSMENT AND LEARNING

We know that improvement is continuous and that our experiences, mistakes and successes are the basis for us to improve our network more and more. Therefore, the Rejudes strategic document brings several recommendations and directions for **systematic teaching**, assessment and learning practices.



A call to action

Defending an agenda goes far beyond believing: not to be an innocuous defense, it is necessary to have objectives, systematization and a lot of effort. For Rejudes, strengthening the voice and participation of young people in political decisions and in the formulation of public policies that directly affect their lives requires establishing a concrete **Advocacy Plan**.

But... what is an Advocacy Plan?

The Advocacy Plan is closely connected to what you advocate for. It is a form of activism that seeks to give voice to individuals or groups that face challenges, injustices or discrimination, in order to achieve better living conditions and guarantee rights.

The importance of advocacy lies in its ability to create significant impact in diverse sectors of society. By promoting awareness of social problems, injustices or neglected issues, advocacy stimulates the change of mindsets, breaking stigmas and broadening public debate. This can lead to the formulation of more inclusive and fair policies, the protection of fundamental rights and the strengthening of communities.

IMPACT In addition, advocacy plays a crucial role in giving marginalized groups a voice allowing them to be heard and represented in decisions that affect their lives. It empowers individuals, providing them with tools and resources so that they can actively participate in building solutions for the challenges they face. Advocacy also plays a crucial role in creation of systemic and lasting changes. When identifying gaps in existing policies and requiring corrective actions, this practice can help remodel social, economic and political structures that perpetuate inequality and exclusion. Rejudes works with a quadrennial Advocacy Plan, and our current one (2023-2026) is: **Ensuring inclusive** equitable education with quality, promoting opportunities for

learning throughout life to all people.



National Meetings

The Rejudes national meetings are a reflection of the work carried out by young people throughout the year on the theme chosen at the previous meeting. It is an intense moment, marked by diversity and enthusiasm, where young Rejudians engage in activities, workshops, Ordinary Assembly and dynamic lectures. It is in these meetings that Rejudes reaffirms its commitment to Brazilian youth and discusses the group's achievements and challenges, aligning the theme to be worked on in the following period and defining directions for national, regional and local actions.

Awards and recognition

In the year 2022, Rejudes wins its first prizes, being recognized nationally and internationally for the work developed and the actions carried out along its trajectory.

In December, we won the 21st edition of **Ser Humano Award** of the Brazilian Association of Human Resources -Minas Gerais Section (ABRH-MG) in the category 'NGO'.

The Ser Humano Award was established in 1993 by the social organization ABRH and has established itself as an important instrument for valuing the best initiatives in people management. It is awarded annually to organizations whose innovative practices have achieved significant results and can be considered a benchmark in the market.

In April, we won the 1st edition of **Connection Awards** from ChildFund International, a recognition of actions that create connections, with financial incentive to invest in actions during the year.

The award received 18 entries from various initiatives for children and young people of the ChildFund from different countries.





First Youth Entrepreneurship Fair

One of the themes that Rejudes works on is entrepreneurship. The network therefore encourages local youth groups to organize individual and collective initiatives aimed at the development of ideas promoting the potential of young people and generating income.

A major milestone for the visibility of the actions carried out by Rejudes in this theme was the **1st Festival of Entrepreneurial Youth**, an event that took place in 2019 in Vale do Jequitinhonha, Minas Gerais. Lasting for two days, the Festival reached 700 people, performing **five workshops** about entrepreneurship, **14 cultural presentations** (circus, choirs, bands, theaters and individual singers), in addition to the **exhibition and sale** of various handicraft art and gastronomy products from the entrepreneurial initiatives of young Rejudians.

The event encouraged the valorization of enterprises focused on art and culture in the territories, enabled the identification of opportunities for new actions in this area and, mainly, was an opportunity to show that **youth can make, create and build.**

Free Youth Conferences

Free conferences are meetings organized by any person, organization or institution interested in mobilizing others to discuss issues related to public policies. It is an important instrument of social participation for formulating joint proposals and achieving a common goal. For this reason, in August 2017, the month in which we celebrate International Youth Day, Rejudes' local committees held free conferences on the theme **Youth and Social Participation** in the municipalities where they operate, bringing together young rejudians and other local youth movements.

With the conference's success in 2017, the year 2018 came with a new challenge: the 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals – goals to be achieved by the countries that make up the UN, as is the case of Brazil! These goals involve the whole of society, mobilizing governments, businesses, organizations and communities.

With the theme: **Young people, it's time for SDGs**, Rejudes also held 22 pre-conferences in June and July 2018, aimed at preparing youth and the community for the conferences in August. The Working Groups of the Free Conferences had as their theme the five strategic SDGs of Rejudes:











Prepara Rejudes

No one can deny that the national meetings are landmark events in the history of Rejudes. But all the planning and mobilization involved in preparing for the participation of young people in the meetings is as important as the big date.

Prepara Rejudes* comprises a series of decentralized actions promoted by the committees, which seek to prepare, annually, the Rejudian youth for the national meeting. Prepara always happens in August, month in which we celebrate International Youth Day, and conducts its work addressing mainly the theme that will set the tone for the following National Meeting.

And what happens in Prepara? Oh, so much good stuff! There are workshops, lectures, conversation rounds, debates, dynamics and challenges, cultural presentations and, most importantly, a lot of connection between the Rejudians. It is one more opportunity to strengthen the network and share experiences and knowledge.



The regional events of Prepara are part of the unified Rejudes calendar and have the support and guidance of the National Committee in the preparation of the workshops and activities that will be offered. "It's of utmost importance to be aligned with our actions, so that we can strengthen our work, develop awareness about the role of young people in Rejudes. Walking together, we will strengthen our goals, reducing the geographical distance that separates us, leaving our mark in the spaces of discussion, showing to the youth that together we are stronger", says Italo, Rejudes National Committee.

the access to education, culture, leisure, policy and decision-making areas are rights. Being in these places is the beginning of my possible dreams and for sure is the gateway to guarantee everything that is mine."

We have already achieved a lot, but we want to grow even more! We always glimpse possibilities of expansion and strengthening of our network and the pursuit of new opportunities to add to the sustainable development of Brazil's youth and around the world. Jorge, former Youth Representative from Rejudes, shares his expectations for the future of Rejudes:

PROCESS OF REJUDES IMPLEMENTATION

STEP 1

Feasibility analysis and formalization of the partnership

At this stage, meetings are held involving representatives of ChildFund Brasil, Rejudes National Committee and other youth organizations or collectives with the aim of analyzing the feasibility of implementing Rejudes in new territories.



STEP 2

Rejudes Implementation

With the partnership agreed, the ChildFund Brasil team conducts training to present the stages and promote the immersion of the actors involved. The Rejudes National Committee works by sharing with its peers the processes and good practices, promoting moments of dialogue, sharing and proposals.

STEP 3

Young people join in Unified Network Agenda

Local, regional and national meetings, leading an integrated work agenda.

Young people integrate the Network governance bodies

GENERAL ASSEMBLY:

With representation of young people from all Rejudes localities, it has a deliberative and validation function in ordinary and extraordinary meetings.

LOCAL COMMITTEE:

Young people gather in their municipalities, structuring interventions that meet the demands of youth.

REGIONAL COMMITTEE:

Young people elected from the local committee, which has the function of representing the youth of the territory.

NATIONAL COMMITTEE:

Young people elected from the regional committee by their peers and who perform the function of representing young people throughout the network, promoting dialogue with other actors, representing Rejudes in the various spaces and managing the processes at the national level.



TEP 5

Planning to intervene

Each local committee, integrated into the unified annual Agenda of the network (which is structured in assembly with the support of the National Committee), builds its planning, schedule of meetings, meetings and actions specific to its community context. The local committees, together with the governance of the partner organization, deliberate on the budget for the implementation of activities in the fiscal year. The network, to implement its actions, seeks to retain partnerships and raise funds.



Rejudes has the following structure of support, assistance, mobilization, planning, evaluation and monitoring:

In the work based on Youth, two actors are present, youth educators and network articulators. These professionals are subsidized by ChildFund Brasil's local partners in the municipalities where they work.

The attribution of the partner organizations is to ensure the functioning of the network with structure, installation of environments and all necessary conditions for young people to participate.

The areas of Programs and Advocacy of ChildFund Brasil contribute to the mobilization of partners and strategic directions that strengthen the incidence of the network.
